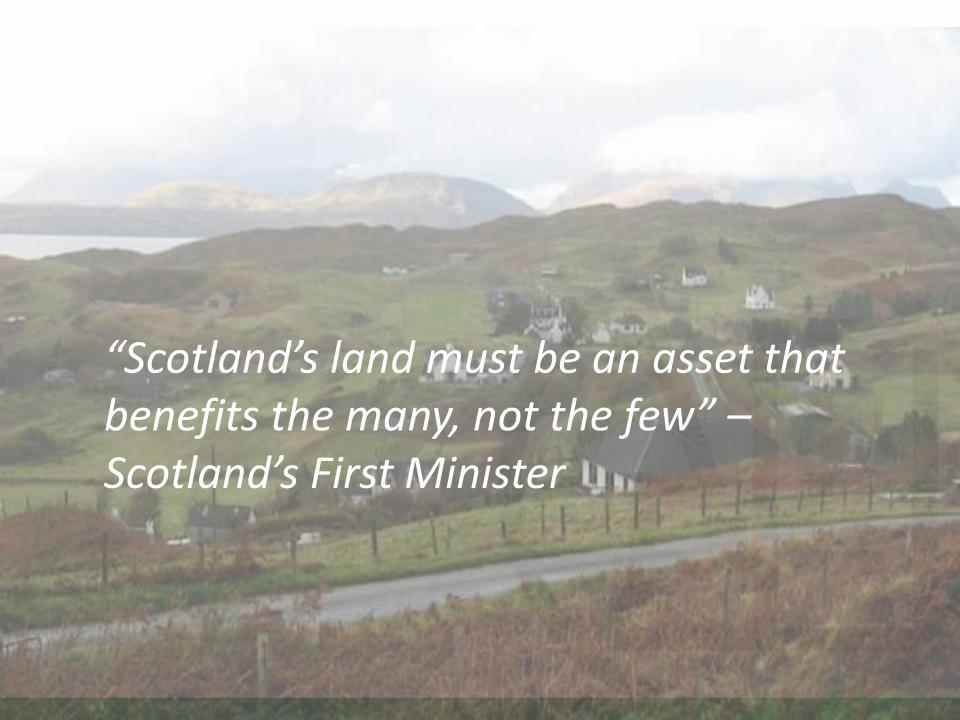

- Health and wellbeing



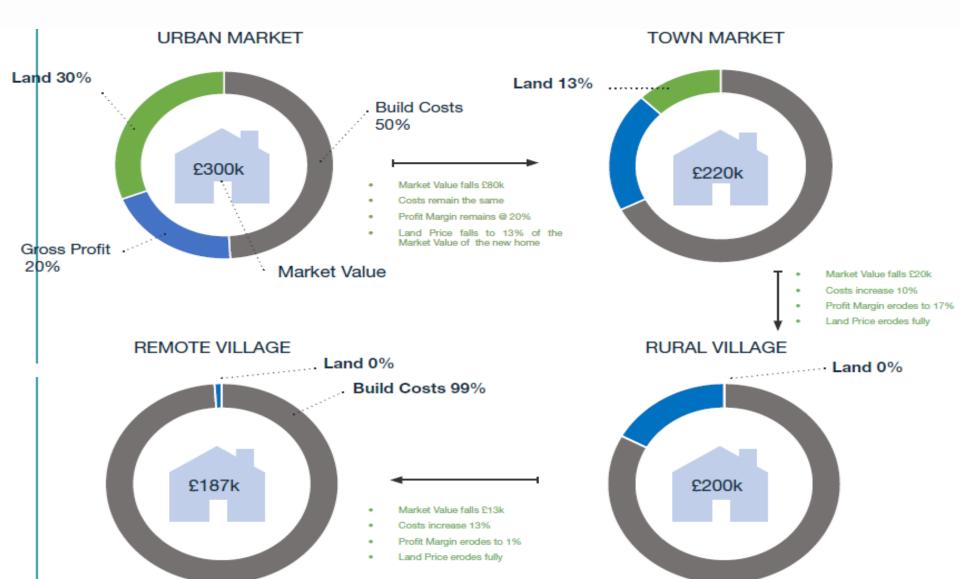




- Developers focus on high value greenfield sites to reduce risk and maximise profit
- Decline in development of brownfield land since 2007 and decline of SMEs
- Most rural areas do not have the value for volume housebuilders
- Significant new build affordable housing programme – for unmet need

# Community Ownership & Community Empowerment

#### Isle of Gigha:

- Population Growth
- Better wealth distribution
- Increase in participation in decision making



### **New Land Reform Bill**

- Measures to regulate the market in large scale land transfers
- Public Interest Test for Large Scale Land Transfers
- Test could see land split into lots for sale or the land offered in whole or parts to local constituted community bodies



## Timescale for Bill

- Consultation closes 30<sup>th</sup> October 2022
- Main policies finalised December 2022
- Cabinet clearance June 2023
- Bill Introduced September 2023
